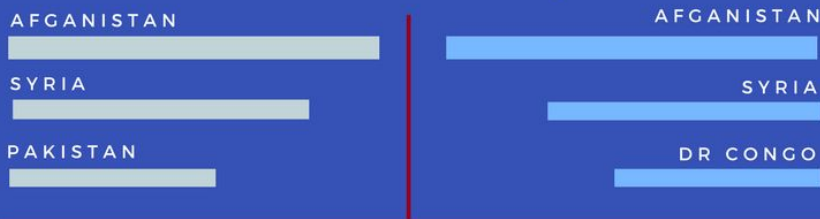

During Phase I of the SOAM Programme **315 people** were reunited with other family members in Europe either through DUBLIN III or through other migration procedures.
